Dr. Michael Breault, NYSDA President

He resides in Schenectady where he also is in private practice, limited to Periodontics and Surgical Placement of Implants.

Dr. Breault is a member of the 4th District Dental Society, a Diplomate in the American Academy of Periodontology, and a member of the American Academy of Oral Medicine, the Upper New York State Society of Periodontists. He has authored a number of articles and has given many educational presentations and clinics. Dr. Breault is the recipient of the St. Clare's Hospital award for Clinical Excellence in Teaching.

Chester J. Gary, D.D.S., J.D.

Is a faculty member of the University at Buffalo School of Dental Medicine in the Restorative Dentistry Department. He lectures 2nd, 3rd, and 4th year students regarding law, jurisprudence, ethics and regulatory compliance. Besides his duties as assistant clinical professor in the restorative department, Dr. Gary is the course director for the SUNY Buffalo risk management program. He is also an adjunct faculty member at the Erie County Community College where he lectures dental hygiene students.

This course was developed by the New York State Dental Foundation to help dentists fulfill the New York State mandate required for licensure. The mandate requires completion of this three (3) hour course on a one time basis.

The presentation will include the application of the principles of law and justice as they relate to the practice of dentistry in New York State. Attendees will learn the laws, rules, regulations and ethical principles relating to the practice of dentistry. The course material includes ethical principles such as those of the NYSDA pursuant to section 5 of Chapter 987 of the Laws of 1971. Case studies will also be presented and discussed by the speakers, an attorney and a dentist.

At the end of this course practitioners will have the ability to:

- Recognize ethical components of conflicts that occur in the practice of dentistry.
- Define alternatives when deconstructing situations where ethical principles can be applied.
- Evaluate and consider alternatives when faced with a ethical conflict.
- Apply regulations, standards and professional expectations to real life ethical conflicts.
